TEACHING COURSES TAUGHT

2020-present	Ceramic Sculptural Processes – CCER 206 Designed for second-year students to be an introduction to hand-building processes. Introducing coil, pinch, slab, and solid construction, focusing on sculptural concepts.
2020-present	Mold Mechanisms – CCER 507 (formerly 207) Designed for second-year students to be an introduction to slip-casting and mold- making. Introducing plaster through a series of interconnected exercises while focusing on segmentation, problem-solving, and spatial concepts.
2021-present	Advanced Ceramics Processes – CCER 311/611 Designed for advanced undergraduate and graduate students. It is a course about developing novel approaches to working with hand-building, wheel-throwing, and/or slip-casting. Students are directed by prompts. Demonstrations are designed around the needs of each specific cohort. Advanced technical and intellectual practices are the focus of the semester.
2022-present	Josiah Wedgwood's Legacy – CCER 128 Examines the evolution of 18th-Century European ceramics under the influece of Josiah Wedgwood's innovative spirit. Through a combination of research-based exploration and hands-on, immersive learning, students develop an understanding of the impact ceramics manufacturing had on social dynamics, business practices, technologies, diision of labor, and Neoclassical style.
2015-present	Thesis Initiation – CCER 790 Ceramics Thesis Initiation is the third of a four-semester sequential class covering the advanced aesthetics and techniques of ceramics and culminating in the Master's of Fine Art thesis.
2015-present	Ceramics Thesis Resolution – CCER 890 Ceramics Thesis Resolution is the final course covering the advanced aesthetics and techniques of ceramics. Working from an approved topic of investigation for the Master's Thesis, students work independently and create a body of work supported by a written Thesis paper.
2019-2023	Ceramics Graduate Studio - CCER 601 An advanced aesthetics and techniques of ceramics course culminating in the Master's of Fine Arts Thesis. It is structured on the basis of the individual student's needs, interests, and background preparation as they may be determined through faculty counseling.
2021	Thrown Vessel Forms – CCER 211 Designed for second-year students to be an introduction to wheel throwing processes. Introducing centering, throwing, shaping, trimming, and resolving form, while focusing on utilitarian concepts.
2020	College of Art and Design Alum: Community and Beyond – IDEA 150 Explores the rich community of alumni from the College of Art and Design. Students participate in Interviews, artist talks, and virtual tours as a means to introduce incoming students to the expansive community of RIT CAD alumni and beyond.
2018-2020	3D Applications: The Figure – ILLS 209 Students build upon their experience in 3D Design I including materials, and building processes, while constructing the human figure. Team-taught; I led mold-making components.

2018	STAR topics: Ceramics and Wood – STAR 250 Introduces basic woodworking and ceramics working procedures in a collaborative discourse in material and process; challenging freshmen to solve aesthetic and conceptual problems by way of designing and creating through introductory wood and ceramic working techniques.
2014-2019	Ceramics Sophomore 1 – CCER 201 Introduces students to wheel-throwing techniques as used in functional ware. Emphasis will be placed on design, preparation, and process.
2015-2019	Ceramics Sophomore 2 – CCER 202 Introduces students to hand-building and mold-making techniques as a foundation to create sculptural ceramic vessels. Emphasis will be placed on the design, preparation, and execution of compositional elements in three-dimensional forms.
2014-2019	Ceramics Junior 1 – CCER 301 Introduces students to industrial forming methods of ceramics. Students will develop drawings/proposals and a strategy for production. The students will then produce molds for slip casting as a means to produce multiples of consistent quality.
2015-2019	Ceramics Junior 2 – CCER 302 Investigates the properties of the sculptural ceramic vessel to develop the student's personal aesthetic and visual thinking. Assigned projects will evoke the student's imagination and ceramic vocabulary through the relationship between concept, design, form, surface embellishment, and choice of firing methods and glazes. A systematic investigation of ceramic clays, raw materials, glaze materials, glaze composition, and glaze calculation will be presented in lectures and assignments.
2014-2018	Ceramics Senior 1 – CCER 501 The first semester of the senior year. It is a proposal-based, individualized course where the work is refined with discussion through faculty and group critique. Discussions relating to career choices, graduate and post-graduate opportunities, job hunting, portfolio, resume writing, operating a studio, merchandising, and business practices will coincide with studio work.
2015-2018	Ceramics Senior 2 – CCER 502 This is the second of a two-semester course in which seniors will produce a project and must be able to offer evidence of qualification as a candidate for the baccalaureate degree to be approved by the faculty. The goal is to produce a coherent body of work of high standard which must be exhibited at a venue at the end of the school year.
2014-2020	Hand Building (3 credit elective) – CCER 530-01 An elective course for any student that is an introduction to hand-building processes. Introducing coil, pinch, slab, and solid construction, focusing on sculptural concepts.
9999-5555	Slip Casting and Mold Making (3 credit elective) – CCER 530-03 CCER 630 - 03 An elective course for any undergraduate or graduate student that is an introduction to slip-casting and mold-making. It covers the fundamental techniques and aesthetics of working with plaster and slip-casting clay.
2014-2016	Crafts Graduate Seminar – CGEN 702 Examines the investigative process required for a craft artist to develop a comprehensive and well-integrated body of work. Students review the work of known artists and will research the themes and issues in their own work. They will work with the faculty and their thesis committee to develop strong viable themes for their thesis.
